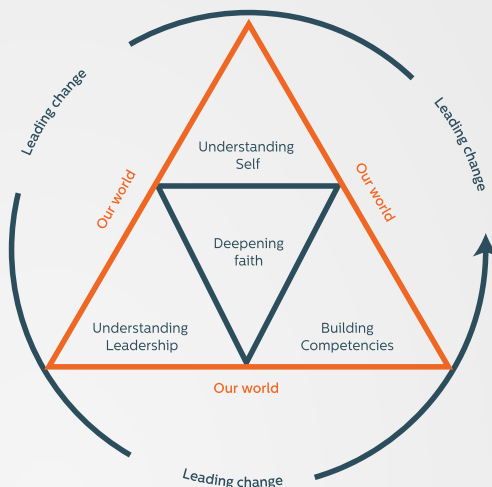

About the Central Leadership Program

Introduction

The Central Leadership Program seeks to raise Christ-centered Leaders who will effect change in all spheres of life. Our unique combination of curriculum blocks forms the foundation of our fellowships, projects, and programs.

CLP Gold is our flagship program. It is a yearlong fellowship for tertiary students and graduates from ages 18 to 24 years old. This program is currently training its 6th cohort of fellows. Overall, there have been over 100 fellows on the program.



The program culminates in the implementation of a Social Impact Project. CLP Crystal is our newest program tailored to suit High School Students. It is currently being piloted with 10 fellows.

PROJECT BOXERS AND LINERS *by Team MEGAS*

For phase 1 of this Social Impact Project, the team has been able to develop a chat bot that can help adolescents to be well educated on their Sexual and Reproductive Health issues. The team visited Crown Prince Academy (LAPAZ) and held a presentation to better enlighten the students on the use of Megas AI as a tool for answering all questions concerning their Adolescent reproductive health.

The group was also supported by a presentation by Dr. Rhoda Esinam Badu during their presentation.

The team also donated sanitary pads and complimentary souvenirs to advertise the MEGAS AI. Special appreciation goes to Mr. John Akoto Basil and to the Principal of Crown Prince Academy (Mr Kablan). THE POWER PROJECT *by Domino Effect*

The Power Project aims to empower Ghanaian youth, particularly those in orphanages, by fostering a healthy interest in STEM fields and providing entrepreneurial skills.

This initiative aligns with Goals 2 and 18 of the African Union's Agenda 2063, focusing on STEM education and youth empowerment. The project seeks to equip orphans with self-sustaining skills, reducing reliance on spontaneous donations promoting self-sufficiency.

So far, the Power Project has reached 25 children at the Motherly Love Orphanage in Accra, providing them with basic IT skills.

The selected children have been taken through courses ranging from understanding the importance of IT in our society to using the Microsoft office tools and how to navigate the Internet safely.

The goal is to help these children develop a sense of worth and active contribution to their personal and community development.

HERITAGE PROJECT *by Team Ithemba*

The Heritage Project aims at enhancing the educational experience and self-esteem of primary school children by sharing Africa's true history. The team is made up of Akua Amponsah, Nelly Ankrah, Collins Onyame, Kekeli Amenu, Julius Ogbey & Eliza Coffie.

The team's project aligns with the Central Leadership Program's transformative focus and goal 18 of Agenda 2063.

So far, they have held a workshop for the upper primary students of the Dawhenya D/A basic school. They used teaching and learning materials for history lessons and also engaged the children in confidence-boosting activities.

For the team's next steps, they plan on replicating the workshop for other upper primary school children. The team is also developing an educational material that will be distributed on a larger scale to other schools. Special appreciation goes to Rev. The team has also developed an initial version of our interactive AI powered chat bot, that provides expert certified mental health information and support.



For future plans, the team hopes to expand their speaking engagements to reach more schools and communities. They also hope to enhance their social media presence and fully develop and launch their chat bot to offer 24/7 mental health support and information.
