About the Central Leadership Program

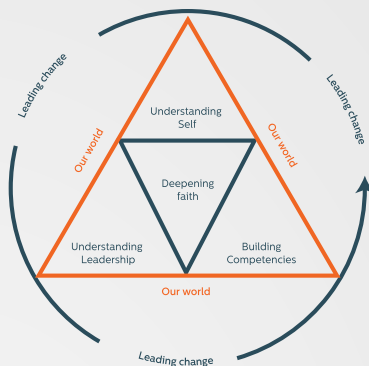
The Central Leadership Program (CLP) organizes its fellowships, projects, and initiatives around its distinct curriculum blocks, each designed to foster leadership development across various age groups and professional stages.

CLP Gold

Our flagship program, CLP Gold, is a one-year fellowship aimed at tertiary students and recent graduates aged 18 to 24. This program has been successfully running for the past five years, and to date, over 100 fellows have participated.

CLP Crystal

CLP Crystal, designed for high school students aged 14 to 17, has been successfully launched. The first cohort is now graduating, marking a significant milestone for the program.



CLP Platinum

The CLP Platinum program is aimed at professionals aged 25 to 35. This fellowship is currently in the design phase and is scheduled for launch in 2026. It will focus on advancing the leadership potential of young professionals, equipping them with the tools needed to navigate complex professional environments and excel in senior leadership positions.

The Central Leadership Program continues to evolve, aiming to shape the leaders of tomorrow through structured, impactful, and relevant learning experiences.



General Overseer's Remarks

Team Mindshift

Under the guidance of their SIP Mentor Mrs. Judith Kabukie Ocansey, Mindshift Inc., comprising Abena Tenewaa Omari, Sylvia Emeфа Seamegbe, Akua Aduwaa Brifo, and Deladem Kofi Fiakeye, is spearheading "Project Mindshift." This project aims to empower African youth by fostering cultural pride, self-esteem, and historical understanding through engaging interactive learning and storytelling methods. The team has already delivered identity and leadership workshops in three schools and established a blog highlighting African history. Looking ahead, they intend to create educational apps, a YouTube channel, student clubs, and Afrocentric comics, and are currently seeking support in the form of publication funding, comic artists, and story writers to realize their vision of impactful African-centered educational materials.



Team Blessed

Team Blessed, comprised of Ohemaa Yeboah Bonsu, Keron Achiaa Yeboah, Kwaku Anuonyam Amoakohene, and Queen Joie-Zoe Abrahams-Appiah under the mentorship of Mr. Kweku Lartey, is undertaking the “Crafted for Purpose” project. This student empowerment initiative aims to equip young students with digital and employable skills like beads making, soap making, and tie and dye, aligning these skills with meaningful life goals through workshops, mentorship, and hands-on training. Having completed digital skills training at Abraham Lincoln International in Abuakwa and raised funds, the team is now preparing for skills training at Teshie Senior Technical School in Greater Accra with support from Richlove Avor Foundation. Future plans include further training sessions and a skills-based competition, with the team seeking sponsorships (financial or materials) and promotional assistance to broaden their impact.



Green Giants

Guided by their SIP Mentor Ms. Sylvia Sinkari, The Green Giants – Steven Boakye Donkor, Samuel Bright Yeboah, Shimtso Blagogee, and Priscilla Naa Dedei – are launching AFA PAPA (Agriculture For All: Planting As a Personal Attitude) to transform students’ perception of agriculture into a personal, practical, and purposeful activity. Their plan involves creating school agric hubs, starting at La Yahoushua Basic School, where students will sustainably grow food using recycled materials, promoting home gardening and agricultural passion. Having successfully initiated the project and engaged students, their next steps require funding to equip these hubs with essential tools like soil, gloves, buckets, seeds, and watering cans, aiming to cultivate a generation of environmentally conscious young growers





Team GrowSmart

Team GrowSmart is driving Roots & Robots, an initiative merging agriculture with technology to equip students with future-ready skills. Our team includes Samuel Nana Yaw Yeboah Takyi, Akua Kakra Agyepong, and Gyan Kwaku Takyi Faka, under the mentorship of Mr. John Basil Akoto, a seasoned civil engineer and project manager, and Redeemer Salami O., an AI Engineer and BoE. At St. James SHS in Sunyani, we've introduced students to agriculture and the role of technology in farming, while also building their confidence through public speaking and pitching sessions. We've completed hands-on training with Arduino kits to support smart backyard gardening. Currently, the students are working in groups, planting crops and applying all they've learned from tech skills to presentation strategies, as they prepare to pitch their innovative ideas to stakeholders and guests. We are seeking financial support, volunteers, and expert facilitators to further strengthen and sustain this transformative learning experience.

Team Wakanda

Team Wakanda, comprising James Kojo Boadu, Fynnba A. Harrison, Benedicta Hayford, and Amanda Efua Essel-Donkor, is leading the Mentor A Student Initiative under the guidance of SIP mentor Dr. Pearl Esenam Dumenu. This social impact project aims to offer career guidance and mentorship to reduce youth unemployment in Ghana. The goal is to help students become more self-aware, gain career insights, and develop entrepreneurial mindsets through a robust mentoring network supported by experienced professionals.

So far, three impactful sessions have been held, covering self-awareness, goal setting, and personal leadership. We also organized a virtual conference, "Creating Your Own Job Opportunities in a Tough Job Market" which attracted 75 participants, while over 500 individuals engage in a WhatsApp group where career-tailored opportunities are shared daily.

We are excited to continue the journey with our mentees and plan to conclude the program with an educational tour. To do this, we seek funding support for refreshments and logistics.

Together, we can shape a generation of confident, visionary leaders.

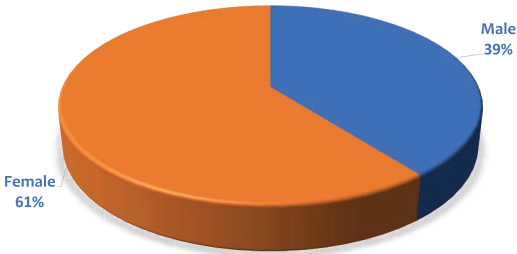

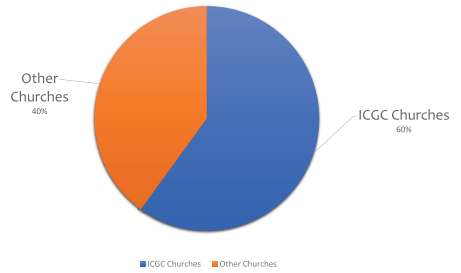

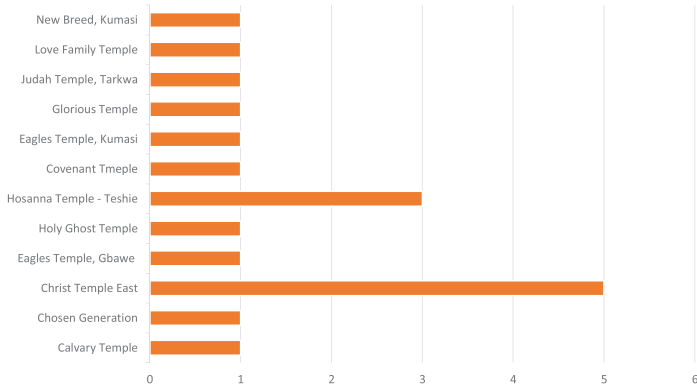
Gender Representation For Cohort 7



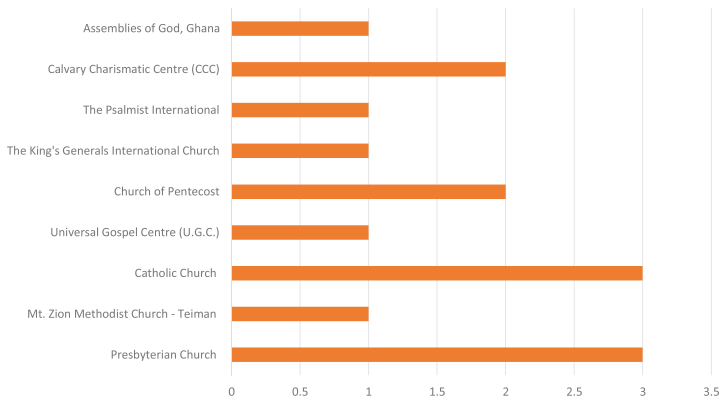

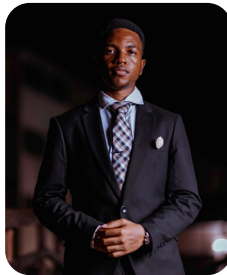

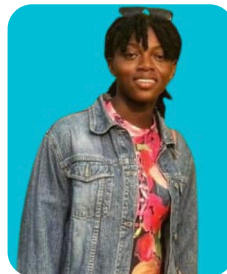
